Report of Officers

Treasurer's Report: Rachel Wiesner

The 2021-22 fiscal year ended with \$73,432.12 in the checking account, \$4,860.50 in the savings account, and \$0 in the PayPal account as of June 30.

A review of last year's financials was performed by two non-check signing board members. The two reviewers, the president and the previous treasurer signed off on the review but noted there were some budget line items that went over. The 2022-23 budget approved at the final PTA meeting in May increased several categories to help prevent overages this year, and a vote will be held tonight in hopes of increasing a few more. Anyone who would like to look through the records themselves is welcome to do so; just let the board know.

Following the financial review there were some items budgeted for the 2021-22 fiscal year that were processed in August - \$13,000.79 in Boosterthon fees and \$130.92 in yearbook expenses. Taking these into account, the 2021-22 fiscal year resulted in \$10,542 in net income despite a projected loss of \$27,050. May and June Cash Details are included in your handouts tonight, as well as the final profit and loss report.

July and August financials will be presented at the October meeting due to the Treasurer's laptop crashing the night before the meeting. September financials should also be ready at that time.

Proposed Budget Amendments

- Raise the Book Vending Machine line item from \$6,000 to \$6,840 to account for the difference between estimated and actual shipping costs, and to purchase books to distribute from the time the vending machine is installed through the PTA Scholastic Book Fair in December, after which point, we plan to use Scholastic Dollars for future book purchases.
- Raise the Fall Fun Fair expenses from \$2,000 in Food Expenses and \$6,000 in General Expenses (\$8,000 in total expenses), to \$12,500 in General Expenses. The estimate of \$8,000 in income is also being lowered to \$4,000.

Vice President's Report: Lindsey Schwartz

Presidents' Report: Lisa Turner and Rachel Rayburn

Using funds from last year's Fun Run, we proposed to include two major purchases for the school. These were approved at last year's budget meeting in May. Over the summer, we donated \$6090 (which includes freight, shipping and set up) of a Bookworm vending machine. The donation was approved by the Fairport BOE and they will be purchasing the machine so that Brooks Hill takes ownership. We expect to have it in place hopefully before the holidays. We plan on stocking the machine with books for all grade levels and using it as a Brooks Hill PTA Birthday Book program. As students celebrate their birthdays they will be awarded a token to use at the vending machine and pick out a book.

The second large donation approved and made over the summer was for \$6054.51 to fund the addition of the second gaga pit for the playground. This has been accepted and ordered already from the BOE and we expect it hopefully soon.

The PTA also supports the PBIS initiative by purchasing Principals' Recognition vinyl water bottle stickers to go along with certificates awarded to students who earn the award monthly.

The Fairport elementary PTA's are proud to sponsor the Center Park Movie night taking place this Friday At Center Park, featuring Encanto. This event is free, and registration is online and encouraged but is not required. The event will feature face painting, gaga ball, and food and snacks for purchase.

Report of Coordinators

Fall Fun Fair - Lisa Christensen and Lisa Cavanaugh

Date: Saturday, October 15 from 11 to 3

Excited to implement the best parts of last year's new outdoor format, while also including everyone's classic favorites

Biggest change: FREE FOR STUDENTS!

Due to the incredible fundraising at the Fun Run, we are able to put this together at minimal cost to families

How it works:

Each student will get a 20-punch card

Credit card sized, plastic, on a lanyard

Will be handed at the check-in tent upon arrival to FFF

Additional Punch Cards available for \$5 each (if a student wants to do extra activities, non-student family members)

Punches can be used for EVERYTHING except food trucks

Like last year, playground area is a "punch-free" zone: Gaga Pits, Hover Archery, and playground

Biggest Improvement from last year: Larger Main Tent

More than double the side of last year

Should be able to accommodate diners as well as crafts tables

Also have an indoor rain plan in case of really poor weather

Event Info:

Like last year, we plan on utilizing the front parking lot for a majority of our activities

This will necessitate most people parking at Minerva Deland School, we will be running a shuttle bus again

Includes: Farm-fresh apples, donuts, chips and crackers, cotton candy, juice boxes, and other beverages

Finally, everyone's favorite event! The Treat Trot (FKA Cake Walk) will be in the cafeteria and in the same format as last year

We are sticking to the store-bought requirement

Everything from the traditional cakes to cereal to gift cards...treats of any variety are welcome!
